#### **SECUELA**

Is it important to regularly attend Secuelas if you already belong to a Reunion Group? Some Community members probably have asked this question. Or, maybe the question is "Since I have attended Tres Dias and have worked on a few teams, is it necessary to become involved in Secuelas or Reunion Groups".

A good question, but one that was probably answered already on your weekend.

You remember on Sunday afternoon on your weekend, the Rector (or maybe it was the person giving the Reunion

Group talk) said something like this:

"For the past three days we have been in this very secure environment, far removed from the world we left behind on Thursday when you arrived here. When you leave here you will do one of two things. (I) You can go home and remember a great weekend with good fellowship and good lessons, do nothing else and it will have little or no lasting influence on the rest of your life; or (2) you will apply the lessons learned, get involved in a Reunion Group and Secuelas, serve on future teams, and 10 or 15 years from now you will look back to this weekend as the weekend that changed your life

The word Secuela is a Spanish word which means "sequel" in English. It suggests a result, consequence, or subsequent development. The purpose of a Secuela is to gather together as a Christian community to reinforce, support, and encourage the experience of the three days. It is different from a Reunion Group because you get to visit with old friends made during your weekend, testify as to your 4th day experiences with the Community, and get a chance to meet and bond with Pescadores who may not have been there when you made your weekend. It brings us closer to God by being able to fellowship with His sons and daughters.

#### WHO WILL BE THE GREATEST


Luke 9:46-48

46 An argument started among the disciples as to which of them would be the greatest. 47 Jesus, knowing their thoughts, took a little child and had him stand beside him. 48 Then he said to them, "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For he who is least among you all—he is the greatest."
