### Meditation

#### A NEW LIFE

The older you are, the more difficult it becomes to deliver a SHORT meditation. This one started out in my mind as being about trust as opposed to fear.

You know the world would have you believe that we all are a product of our environment, what kind of environment we grew up in, how we were raised by our parents, and by what genes we inherited from our parents. How many times have we said or heard someone else say: "I am the way I am because I get it from my Dad or Mom. They had a stubborn streak, or my Mom was a worrier so I am prone to worry a lot. I am shy because my Mother or Dad was shy." But I must tell you, as Christians we cannot use this excuse any more. God has given us the One who can transform us from who we were into whom He wants us to be.

God has provided His Son Jesus as the perfect sacrifice for our sins. When we receive Jesus into our hearts, He has promised His Holy Spirit to lead us. God has also given us His Holy Scriptures as a guide. A good friend of mine once said, "We can have assurance of our destination, but how we make the journey is very important." The verse for the Ladies weekend #23 was from Matthew 11:28-30 "Come to me all you who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for my yoke is easy and my burden is light." I remember this scripture because the banner is hanging on our living room wall.

In the 3<sup>rd</sup> chapter of John, Jesus tells Nicodemus, "You must be born again". It is not about reforming our old life but as Jesus tells us, it is about a new life in Him. John tells us in I John 5:11, 12 "And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal live, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; He who does not have the Son of God, does not have life". Also, in the 14th chapter of John, Thomas said, "Lord, we do not know where you are going and how can we know the way? Jesus said to him, 'I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me'."

I have had a bad back for years. It came from earlier years of carrying heavy typewriters and other equipment and not getting proper exercise. Jane and Marie were talking the other day about how light her lap top computer was. Things have really changed since I began my working career.

As a result of my bad back, when I first get up in the morning, I have had to devote 5 to 10 minutes to exercise that helps my back and enables me to walk. But then my favorite time of the day about 5:15 AM is my special time with my very best friend. It is a time of communion. As I take the bread, I look at it and I see Him on the cross and think about the physical pain He endured just for me. As I take the cup, I think about His blood that was shed for me and I ask for His blood to cover every sin I have committed. I ask Him to help me surrender to the leading of His Holy Spirit so that I might make a difference for Him and His Kingdom.

Our spiritual life begins as we experience that rebirth and our growth continues here on earth until He calls us home to be with Him.

My journey and growth has been so much better since that pretty, fall weekend in 1993 that I spent in Dahlonega at the Camp of Colors.

I encourage you to stay close to Him and take time each day for Him as you make your journey. It is a rewarding journey. Our God is an awesome God.
