My life group has been watching, studying and discussing a series called 'NOT A FAN by Kyle Idleman. He begins by saying:

Twenty times in the New Testament, Jesus Christ issued a compelling and challenging invitation: "Follow Me.: Jesus is not interested in mere fans. He doesn't want enthusiastic admirers. He wants completely committed followers.

The first video shows a man and his family gathering with friends in their home and he has a heart attack and dies. The rest of the videos show how this man went from being a fan to becoming a follower of Jesus Christ.

The fourth week of the study is titled "Bury the Dead". During the videos Kyle shows up in the videos and began to take this man's life apart. This study really made me stop and examine my heart and my own life.

Kyle says this - "Sometimes in an effort to get as many people as possible to follow Jesus I have, with good intentions, made following Him sound as attractive and appealing as possible. I realized that I have been guilty of selling Jesus. And in emphasizing only the parts about Jesus that I thought people would like, and begging people to follow Him, I have unintentionally belittled Him. I'm sorry if I've ever cheapened Jesus or made it sound like we're doing Him a favor by choosing to follow Him.

He uses an example of his daughter. My grown daughter is in college, who is not married, but really wants to be. So I help the process along. I buy an ad in the newspaper and a billboard sign begging someone to choose her. But wouldn't that cheapen who she is? Make it look like they were doing her a favor?

When Jesus invites people to follow Him it wasn't a sells pitch where He emphases all the positive or skip over anything that might be looked over as unappealing or negative.

In Luke 9:23 - Jesus said - If any of you wants to be my follower, you must give up your own way, take up your own cross daily and follow me.

For us, taking up the cross might sound poetic. After all we hang them on our walls and wear them around our necks as a piece of jewelry, but for those living in the first century, the idea of taking up a cross - NOTHING could have been more repulsive. So really it's the cross that separates fans from followers. No fan would ever choose to take up the cross. It represented defeat and disappointment, but more than anything else it represented death and who would want to be associated with that?

Jesus takes the most despised symbol of His time and He says, if you want to follow me, you will need to carry this.

We do everything we can to avoid death. We don't like to talk about it; we don't even like the word. How often have we said of someone - He passed on, He passed away, He's in a better place. We don't want to say it - It's too final -complete.

Yet we learned that following Jesus means dying every day. Every day we take up our cross.

We die to ourselves
We die to our plans
We die to our pleasures
We die to our goals
We die to our sins
We die to our bitterness
We die to our sense of entitlement

At the end of Luke Chapter 9, there are some examples of people who want to follow Jesus. Perhaps some of the same thing's that kept them from following Jesus are the same things that keeps us from following Jesus.

The First Fan - He comes to Jesus in verse 57 as Jesus was walking along with His disciples. This man said to Jesus - I will follow you wherever you go. Wherever - anytime, anyplace, I will follow You- Sounds good doesn't it??

But Jesus knows this man's heart and replied in verse 58 - Foxes have dens to live in and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to live, not even to lay His head.

Jesus is saying to the man - If you are going to follow me you will not be staying the Ritz Carlton, or even a Motel 6, no one is going to leave the light on for us, matter a fact, I'm homeless. Jesus draws attention to the fact that this man loved comfort more than following Him.

Jesus puts this man at a crossroad. You can pursue comfort or you can pursue me, but you can't pursue both.

We are by nature comfort seekers, a culture of hot tubes and country clubs, day spa's and lazy boys. Most of us spend our time and our resources making our lives as comfortable as possible.

Thomas a' Kempes writes - Jesus has many who love the kingdom of God, but few who bear a cross. He has many who desire His comfort, but few who desire His suffering. All want to rejoice with Him, but few are willing to suffer with Him. He writes, there are many who admire His miracles, but there are few who follow in the humiliation of the cross.

In Verse 59 - We meet Fan #2.

Jesus said to another person - Come follow Me. The man agreed, but he said, "Lord, first let me return home and bury my father. Jesus said to Him, Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom.



Kyle tells a story about how a friend of his became a Christian. The story was unusual; a stranger came up to his friend and asks him this question, if you were to die today do you know where you would go? His friend was a little put off by the question but he continued to talk to this guy and by the end of the evening his buddy has accepted Jesus as his Savior. Kyle was thinking it was great but his friend said the problem was he didn't die that night. He spent the dying every day. next decade of his life thinking that he was all right, and living like he wanted too. He didn't understand that he was called to follow Jesus and die to himself daily. His friend said, I wish the man had said that death starts now.

This is what Tres Dias opened my eyes too. I was baptized at age 9 and thought I had my fire insurance. So my adult years were spent searching for the "right man" and living life for my own comfort. De Colorus! Like the old song said - I was looking for love in all the wrong places.

At Tres Dias I heard about the mercy and grace of Jesus Christ. The forgiveness of sins and my debt But in reality the man is putting Jesus off. He is had been paid through Jesus and He loved me unconditionally. It changed my life and I died to self and became a follower of Jesus Christ, not just a fan.

When we attempt to follow Jesus without dying to ourselves, we find we are frustrated with our own failures and we get tired of trying. I have been so tired of trying

In Luke 9:24 Jesus says - If you try to hang on to your life - you will lose it, but if you give up your life for my sake you will



Vida Nueva is a weekend retreat for young men and women ages 15-20. Vida Nueva is Spanish for "New Life" and like the Tres Dias, VN weekends are intended as an encounter with Jesus Christ. The weekends are similar to the structure of a Tres Dias weekend with
