

Meditation - So You Say You Believe

We call ourselves Christians who one day will die and the forgiveness of sins, go to heaven. What does it take to be a Christian? In the resurrection of the body, its simplest form, we are told that we need to believe and the life everlasting. Amen. that Jesus died on the cross for our sins. John 3:16 says it this way, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life". If we look in the Old Testament, Genesis 15:6 says of Abraham, "And he believed in the Lord and He accounted it to him for righteousness."

The church expanded on this with the Apostles' Creed which was said to be a statement of belief used by the Apostles as early as 150 A.D. It states as follows:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth; And in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; * (He descended into hell)

the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven,

and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Al-

from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic** church, the communion of saints,

I was brought up believing that these were the basic tenets of our Christian faith and you needed to believe all of this to get through the Gate. I certainly believed intellectually, so I was good to go.

I have spent a lot of time studying Apologetics which is the historical defense of the scripture. This again was a way to establish an intellectual faith. This was all that I needed. Ephesians 2:8 says it plain and clear, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not by yourselves; it is a gift of God, not of your works, lest anyone should boast".

There is a difference here. Ephesians 2:8 uses the word faith not believe. How are these different. The dictionary defines believe as: accept (something) as true or feel sure of the truth of. The definition of faith is: complete trust or confidence in someone or something or another definition which is perhaps more appropriate here, faith is a strong belief in God or in the doctrines of a religion, based on spiritual apprehension rather than proof. I suppose there is a slight difference here, believe is more scientific based on facts. Apologetically the scripture holds water under this definition when the research is done. Faith as the definition says is based more on spiritual apprehension rather that proof.



So, we start to get into a quagmire here. What do we do? Well I turn to scripture. Hebrews 11 is known as the faith chapter. This seems like a good place to start. Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. Verse 3, By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible. Hebrews 11 continues by describing the actions of great men and women of faith in the Old Testament, Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham and Sarah. These stories are using actions to demonstrate faith. I thought actions did not matter. It can be confusing.

From Hebrews, let's turn to James. We will start at James 2:18, "But someone will say, "You have faith, and I have works." Show me your faith without works, and I will show you my faith by my works. Verse 19 continues, "You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe --- and tremble!" This causes us intellectual types problems. Let me finish with the rest of James 2 beginning with verse 20: "But do you want to know, O foolish man, that faith without works is dead? Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered his son on the altar? Do you see that faith was working together with his works, and by works faith was made perfect? And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." And he was called the friend of God. You see then that a man is justified by works, and not by faith only. Likewise, was not Rahab the harlot also justified by works when she received the messengers and sent them out another way? For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead. So now we know that our faith or belief is perfected (and/ or demonstrated) by our actions. What should our actions be? I could wrap it up here and say simply, "act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with your God." Let's go a little further.

In Matthew 22 when Jesus was asked "which is the great commandment in the law?" Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." Two key points, one it's all about love and two all the Law and Prophets hang on this. This helps me conclude that it's

love, love, love. I like the sermon by Graham Cooke when he says about God that He loves you, because that is what He is like. It is his nature to love. 1 John 4:8 states, "Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love."

This is again punctuated by Galatians 5:22, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." It is no surprise that the first of these is love.

1 Corinthians 13 is known as the love chapter. It reads as follows:

13 If I speak in the tongues [a] of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. ⁴Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. ⁸ Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. 9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. ¹¹ When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. 12 For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. ¹³ And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

So, if we want to know what actions we should do to perfect our faith, Jesus wraps is up in John 13:

34 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."
