Unity in the Body

I don't think it is a mistake that I am sharing after going through a Tres Dias weekend. My husband always says when I come home I cry at almost anything for two to three days after serving. As I was asking the LORD, what He wanted me to share, two thoughts came to my mind Jesus as the Sheep gate and Unity in the Body, but this morning as I was getting ready for the day the message of unity kept playing in my mind.

One thing I see on almost every Tres Dias weekend is every single section of ministry is like a well-oiled machine with everyone playing their part. I know I have not been in the community for very long but there have been very few times that I have seen people on the team behaving in a way that Jesus in their actions is not evident. I am thankful for that because in clear conscience I can recommend that everyone I know go through a weekend. After my weekend, as a candidate, I came home, and I told Bill that "This" is how the church should be all the time. The love, the serving, and attention for each other is exactly what we are called to do in the Body. Sadly, after leaving our mountain experience, unless we are intentional, we can slip back to old habits that cause disunity in the Body.

A few old habits may include;

Gossip about others in the Body, the Pastor, the Elders, and even other churches in our communities.

A judgmental spirit toward those deemed more sinful or not as Holy.

Lack of prayer for the Pastors, the Worship Team, and the members of the congregation.

Not confronting wrong or disunity and instead ignoring it hoping it will go away.

Carrying offences into the church or leaving the church because of offence.

What does the Word tell us about unity in the Body of Christ?

John 17:20-23 "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; ²¹ that they all may be one, as You, Father, *are* in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me. ²² And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one: ²³ I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me."

As Believers, our example comes straight from Jesus. Just as He is one with the Father, we are one with Him, AND one with each other. There is no other way this can be interpreted. Jesus calls us to oneness.

Ephesians 4:29 "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers."

James 1:26 "If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless."

When we do not control our tongue, we lose our witness with others and we also spread discord among the Brethren. One gossip can cause disunity in the whole Body.

Ephesians 4:2-6 "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every

effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."

When we are patient and humble it is hard to get offended with each other. We sometimes hold each other to standards we cannot hope to obtain ourselves and then we judge them at a level that we do not live. My husband said to me one time that I was holding someone to a standard in their early walk with the LORD that I did not attain until after walking for a time. The world will know us by our love for Jesus and our love for one another. When there is disunity in the Body of Christ we are no different than the world around us.

Secretariat Spotlight-Palanca!!!

The Constitution and By-Laws of GMTD set the following qualifications to be the Palanca Couple. The duty is to be performed by a married couple. They are to pray for and then send general palanca letters to the weekends of the communities we support. They are to request and receive general palanca letters for weekends of Georgia Mountains Tres Dias from other movements, print and provide these letters for each weekend. The Palanca Couple attends the third team meeting to explain and present prayer palanca and oven palanca sign-up sheets for each Georgia Mountain Tres Dias Weekend. They send reminders to team members about prayer and oven palanca. They prepare prayer wall and deliver it to the camp at Wednesday night setup along with oven palanca sign-up sheet, general palanca letters and banners for the weekend. They maintain a digital log of all banners and participate in overall guidance and planning of the Tres Dias activities. They ensure that there is to be no individual palanca on candidate beds, but all candidates may get palanca on their bed of same/similar kind and that no doctrinal material of any kind will be distributed on the weekend as palanca or otherwise.

Georgia Mountains Vida Nueva


Vida Nueva is a weekend retreat for young men and women ages 15-20. Vida Nueva is Spanish for "New Life" and like the Tres Dias, VN weekends are intended as an encounter with Jesus Christ. The weekends are similar to the structure of a Tres Dias weekend with certain changes to make it more relevant for teens. VN weekends begin on Friday evening and end on Sunday evening. The cost to sponsor someone on a VN weekend is \$80 and is \$100 for team members. If you have a teenager who you would like to sponsor, you can download an application at the web-site www.gmvn.net. A group of teens who have made a Vida Nueva weekend recently put together a video to tell what
