2 Timothy 3:1-5: "But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people."

These are difficult times. We are in a pandemic attack from an enemy we cannot see. A virus which has crossed the borders of this world. A menace which we are struggling to find a cure, assistance, or a vaccine. This attack has affected our bodies, our minds, our economy, and our ability to function.

Without relief soon we will see our economy suffer even more. Without a cure, many of our loved ones will suffer the effects of this virus. Many have died from this attack. Many more are experiencing the sickness that comes with it. Some seem to be more immune to the outward results of being infected but yet they are still infected.

I am fully aware of the horrific effects of the Corona Virus. But I am talking about the attacks of sin. As 2 Timothy states: in the last days we will see times of great difficulty. These times are caused by sin. I am not saying the Corona virus is caused by sin. I am saying the greater difficulties that this world faces are caused by sin. Sin which exhibits itself in the worst ways possible. Sin which permeates all mankind. Sin infects us all. Our sin nature is so very real. The outward appearance is listed above in 2 Timothy. The scariest part is verse 5: "HAVING THE APPEARANCE OF GODLINESS BUT DENYING THE POWER." This is talking about folks who normally look pretty godly. But then that sin nature shows up again.

Here are some verses which provide some comfort.

Titus 3:1-7 (ESV)

"Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people. For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another. But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

I am so glad that Christ saved me according to HIS mercy rather than my works. I am so grateful that the change in me is a direct result of His work rather than an outward religious act I can put on and take off. Does that make us perfect? Not hardly. We still have to fight the world, the flesh, and the devil. Does that make us arrogant? I hope not since we realize what we have been saved from. See, we have been saved from the very wrath of God that was due our sins. We, who were once enemies of God, have been brought near by the very grace of God poured out upon and in us through the regenerating and renewing power of the Holy Spirit. The death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ has justified and changed us from the inside out.

In conclusion, we will all have to deal with horrible viruses like this corona pandemic. These will come and go. Let us turn to Christ to deal with the eternal issue of the sin problem that can only be solved through the finished work of Jesus.

Secretariat Spotlight-Treasurer!!!

The Constitution and By-laws state the following in regards to the Treasurer role: that is can be filled by a single person or a married couple.

They Treasurer is tasked with maintaining the financial books and records of Georgia Mountain Tres Dias (GMTD). This includes: maintaining the QuickBooks accounting files used to record revenue and expenses of GMTD; disburse funds authorized by the Secretariat through the approved budget; receive funds from weekend's Asst. Head for team weekend fees; receive funds from Pre-weekend Couple for candidate's weekend fees; meet with Asst. Head to discuss financial flow for the weekend and his/her responsibility related to collecting funds; deposit collected funds into GMTD bank account; complete monthly reconciliation of GMTD bank account with QuickBooks account; present monthly financial package to Secretariat; maintain GMTD annual registration with the Georgia Secretary of State; file all income tax returns required for GMTD (form 990). The Treasurer (s) also participate in the overall guidance and planning of the Tres Dias activities.

Vida Nueva is a weekend retreat for young men and women ages 15-20. Vida Nueva is Spanish for "New Life" and like the Tres Dias, VN weekends are intended as an encounter with Jesus Christ. The weekends are similar to the structure of a Tres Dias weekend with certain changes to make it more relevant for teens. VN weekends begin on Friday evening and end on Sunday evening.
